



California Secretary of State Devises 'Print-Your-Own Ballot From Home' Program

In an Aug. 8, 2021 story by the California Globe, a tipster informed the media outlet that there apparently is a program designed to allow anyone in California to be at home and print their own ballot and mail it in. Insane!

As was seen in the Nov. 2020 election, a number of states made changes to their election laws without going through their own state legislature, which has the sole authority to create/modify election laws per the U.S. Constitution. States are now amending their election laws to close the loop-holes and allow voters more access to voting, but at the same time to make sure that only legal ballots are cast.

The story appears to question whether this voting method is being hidden for some reason and a number of other questions are unanswered. The most obvious is how many times can a ballot be printed and mailed in?

Is California leading the way for other states to do the same with how to develop a voting system to allow illegal voting, and just in time for the recall election too. If this story is accurate, then everyone needs to pay attention and let their legislators know that this is unacceptable. State laws are there for a reason and should not, cannot be changed at a whim. Until recently, there has apparently been no media coverage on this issue. Voters should be aware that ballots and how they are printed is VERY specific as described in CA Election Code 13200 et seq. Should a ballot NOT be printed as specified, that ballot could potentially be challenged during the count procedure and ultimately affect the outcome.

This mail-in-ballot system is supposed to be in place on Aug. 16, just in time for fraudulent voting takes place for the Newsom recall.
